### Cutaneous fistula and abdominal pain

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A 54-year-old male presented to the Emergency Department with a recent clinical picture of back pain, right lower abdominal pain, drainage of purulent secretion through a likely fistula in the back for the last three days. He reported a previous history of perinephritic abscess about three months ago.




Figure 2. Axial view of CT of abdomen.




Figure 3. Coronal view of abdominal CT scan.

Abdominal CT scan was performed and revealed the findings shown in Figures 1, 2, 3 and 4. Laboratory tests did not disclose leukocytosis. Intravenous antibiotics were promptly administered and a surgical consultation was requested.
