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Portal vein thrombosis in a patient with ulcerative colitis

Two months ago, there was a normal hepatic perfusion. In the meantime, the patient reported symp-

toms of meteorism and a diffuse abdominal pain which resolved spontaneously.

What is the diagnosis?




Figura 2. The same region at colour Doppler ultrasound.

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
